With much enthusiasm we present to you the offerings in our inaugural Arts in the Valley festival, the first of our planned biennial festivals of classical and fine contemporary music integrated with the visual arts.

The hallmarks of Arts in the Valley will be quality and intimacy: quality music performed by the best musicians in intimate settings within the spectacular backdrop of Kangaroo Valley.


To this end we have assembled musicians from amongst the cream of Australia's performers and chosen some wonderful settings for our concerts, including architect-designed homes, the local churches, the newly refurbished village hall and the beautiful setting of the Kangaroo Valley Golf and Country Resort.

With such a special setting we have invited some inspiring Australian musicians to come to our valley and perform in our festival. Most have never performed in our region before. The music they will perform covers the gamut from the 18th to the 21st centuries; from Bach to Schubert to music receiving its world premiere, including Andrew Ford's new work inspired by the Robertson cemetery and the history of the area. Musicians such as Ian Munro and Geoffrey Tozer are performing together for the first time. Yvonne Kenny will give a recital including special works written for her by our local composers. The connections between music and visual arts and architecture will be explored in two series of very intimate concerts that will allow you, as audience, to get up close and personal with all performers. It promises to be exciting and stimulating, soothing and playful.

Kangaroo Valley has many talented artists, photographers and sculptors. Our festival will give you the opportunity to see the best that the Valley artists have to offer and to purchase any exhibit which appeals. You will also have the opportunity to stretch your legs in a wonderful Kangaroo Valley garden which houses the sculpture exhibition or on the early morning bushwalks if that takes your fancy.

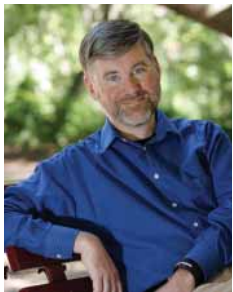

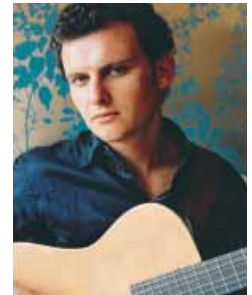

#### **Celebrating our Region**

This will be a most unusual concert in which most of the works celebrate an aspect of the local area.

#### **Match Percussion Duo**

**Daryl Pratt and Alison Eddington** will play works written by Pratt about Bundanon (Arthur Boyd's estate on the Shoalhaven River) and about the local water bodies, Jervis Bay and Seven Mile Beach.

The second half of this concert will feature the world premiere of **Andrew Ford's *Elegy in a Country Graveyard*** which takes the Robertson cemetery as its focal point. The cemetery is as old as Robertson itself, and Ford's *Elegy* evokes its past and present through the memories of local people. Their voices, together with environmental sounds, are woven into a rich tapestry of sound with local choirs and the **Southern Highlands Concert Band**.

*Elegy in a Country Graveyard* is a musical work unique to the area.
